Dresden firebombing, escaped from communist East Germany and how ordinary Germans suffered.

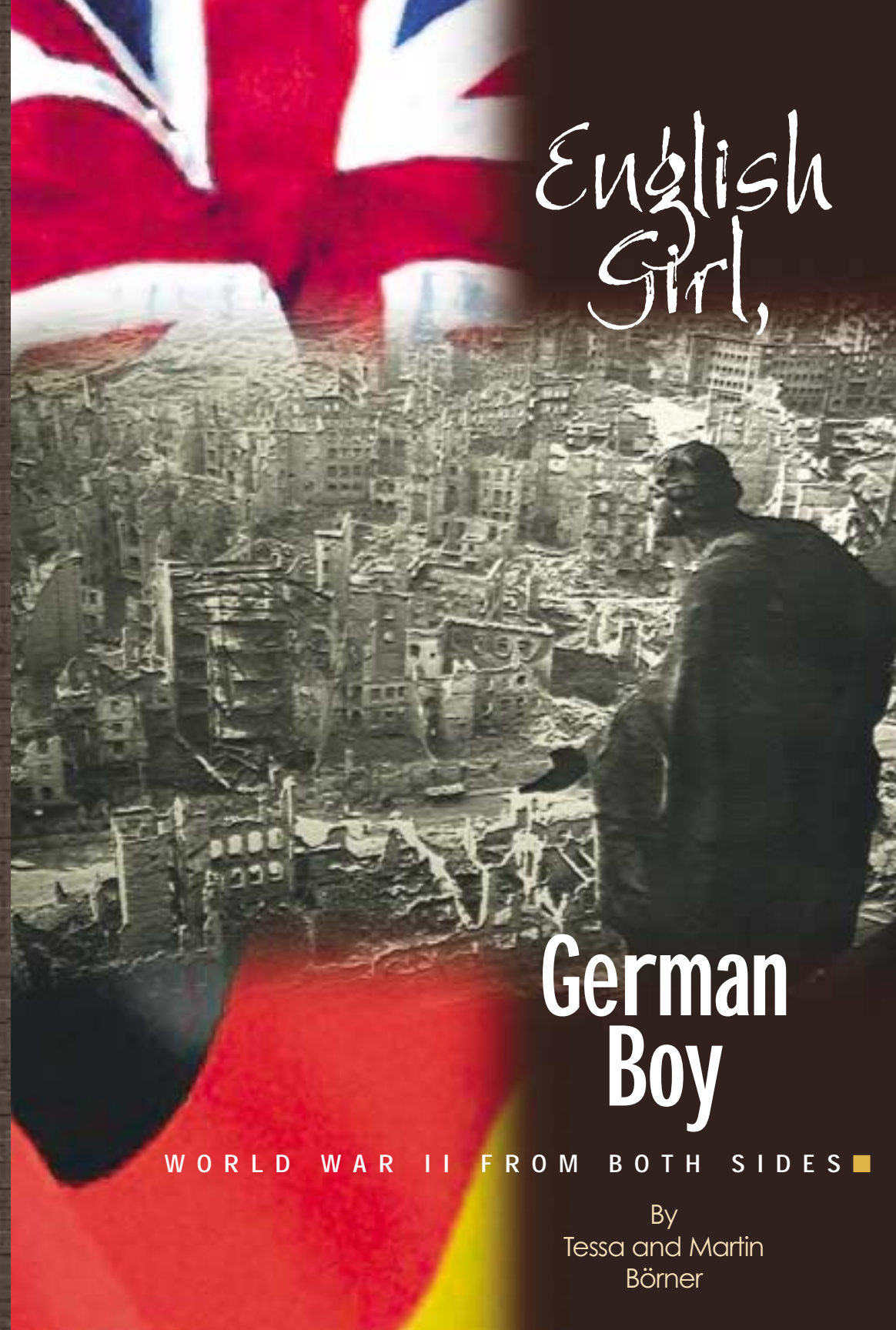
